DON'T WAIT TO ADD WEIGHTS

Strength training is important for a healthier body along with increasing mobility and independence in later years.

Maintaining or building muscle mass is important since adults start losing five to seven pounds of muscle tissue each decade. By the age of 80, sedentary adults may have only 60% of the muscle strength they had as young adults. That type of muscle loss makes it difficult to perform normal, everyday, independent activities such as carrying groceries, getting out of a chair, climbing stairs, and walking any distance.

You don't have to join a fitness center or buy expensive home equipment in order to weight train. Hand-held weights or homemade weights—such as small plastic soft drink bottles filled with water or sand—work just as well. Plus, don't overlook the use of your own body for weight training (for doing push-ups, pull-ups, abdominal crunches, and leg squats).

How to Start Lifting weights:

When you have your doctor's OK to begin a strength-training program, follow these tips:

- Stretch or walk to warm up.
- Choose weights heavy enough to tire your muscles after about 10 repetitions. Take a one to two minute break and perform a second set of 10 lifts.
- Start slowly. When you can easily do 10 or more repetitions of a certain exercise, increase the weight. Stop if you feel pain. Although mild muscle soreness is normal, sharp pain and sore or swollen joints are signs that you're overdone it.
- Work movements that more closely simulate motions you regularly make, like lifting groceries.

- Weight-train two to three days a week. As you are building muscle, rest a day or two between workouts.
- Use free weight. Using a machine is good too, but free weights can help to improve your balance which also worsens with age.

Benefits of Weight Training:

- Raises your metabolism. (Muscle burns more calories than fat.)
- Strengthens bones and reduces the risk of osteoporosis.
- Increases stamina.
- Improves coordination, flexibility, and balance.
- Boosts self-confidence; improves your body image; and reduces the risk of depression.

ENDOWMENT BOARD ANNUAL REPORT – 2009 One year ago we had five CD's with the Church Extension Fund. At this time, we have three CD's which are earning 6% interest. Due to the low interest rate at renewal of the other CD's, we have put the money in the Church Extension Fund Steward Account (Money Market) which is earning more interest than any CD. The three CD's which we have, started out at \$91,000 and they come up for renewal the 1st of October, 2009. We also have two families that have given money to the Endowment Fund which is also in the Steward Account. The balance in the Steward Account is \$987,630 with \$87,912 being for the Endowment Fund. The balance of this account is undesignated memorials.

At our June meeting, the Board voted to give \$1,261 to Trinity Lutheran School, \$742 to each of our two seminary students and \$242 to the following accounts: Organ Fund, Debt Fund and the General Fund.

The Board has spent some of the undesignated memorial money on a new desk for our Business Director (Manager), new lights for the West Wing of the church and for the new carpet in the sanctuary of the church which will be laid later this year.

Board members are Jeff Donald, Nancy Engen, Nadine Hartkemeyer, Dorothy Voelkers, Lowell Schroeder, Leonard Timm, (incoming Chairman) and Kay L. Lenaburg, (outgoing Chairman).



IT IS MORE BLESSED TO GIVE! It is interesting that the one quote from Jesus' lips in the New Testament outside the Gospels deals with giving. Article Published in the Lutheran Witness in 1954:

In 1884 Trinity, Cedar Rapids, Organizes

The year 1884 again brings to our attention the work of Rev. Philip Studt of Luzerne, who was now active in Cedar Rapids. In the year 1883 he had begun conducting services in the U.L.C.A. church and at a later date in an Evangelical church. Under his direction Trinity was organized in 1884 in the section west of the Cedar River known at that time as Kingston. Early means of crossing this river was by ferry. At that time steamboats plied up and down the river with passengers and freight. Early settlers spoke of this city as Rapid City. First location of Trinity's property was on Fourth Avenue and Sixth Street, S.W. The first church was dedicated in 1886. The first resident pastor was the Rev. Julius Deckmann, Sr., who remained in this congregation for 31 years. In the year 1928 the parsonage caught fire, and the flying firebrands ignited the church so that it, too, soon was ablaze. In rebuilding its lost church the congregation moved to its present location on First Avenue, S.W. Services in the meantime were conducted in the school hall. The present brick church was dedicated in 1929. During the pastorate of Rev. Paul Bornhoeft services were conducted on Good Friday in a downtown theater and now are conducted each year on that day over the noon hour in the Coliseum. This annual service is regularly attended by over a thousand people. The pastor's sermon each year is printed in the *Cedar Rapids Gazette* and lately has also been carried over the radio. The Lighted Lantern broadcast was for many years conducted by Pastor Bornhoeft over Radio station WMT, which featured as soloist Eldred Gerhold. Daughter congregations of Trinity are St. Paul's at Marion and Bethany on the East Side of Cedar Rapids.

Trinity has always maintained a Christian day school since its origin in 1884. The first school building was erected in 1890, and the present two-story brick structure was built in 1910. The first called teacher was Mr. Kleme Kambeis, who came in 1885. Present principal of the school is Mr. C.W. Laabs. Present pastor is Rev. E.H. Widmann. Membership January 1, 1953: 859 souls; 536 communicants

the other, one pencil sharpener, six new, unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers, One eraser approximately 2 1/2 " long, 12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors, one box of 16 or 24 count crayons, & one study cloth bag approximately 12" X 14" with cloth handles or drawstring enclosure.



Layette kits: Items needed include: two shirts or Onesies, two gowns or sleepers, two receiving blankets, four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred, one sweater or sweatshirt, two washcloths, one bath-size bar (4-5 oz.) of gentle soap in its original wrapping & two diaper pins.

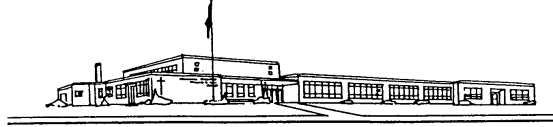
