From the Old Testament

I gave my back to those who strike, and my cheeks to those who pull out the beard; I hid not my face from disgrace and spitting. *Isaiah 50:6*

Applying God's Word to our lives: Jesus' sufferings brought us salvation; saved by grace, we willingly suffer for Christ, remembering His promise, "Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Matt. 5:10).

From the Epistle

So that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. *Philippians 2:10-11*

Applying God's Word to our lives: As Christians, we worship the great Lord and Savior of all people. Think about how great a thing it is—and a privilege—to be a Christian. Share the Good News of Jesus this week.

From the Holy Gospel

Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour. *Matthew 27:45*

Applying God's Word to our lives: The darkness at Jesus' crucifixion shows what a dreadful thing sin is. Soberly consider the reality of your sins, but do not remain there; by faith also see all your sins laid upon Jesus, your Savior!
